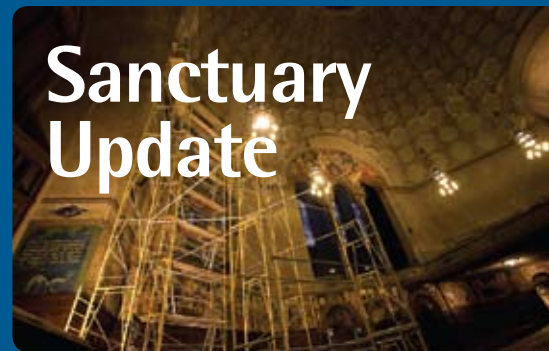

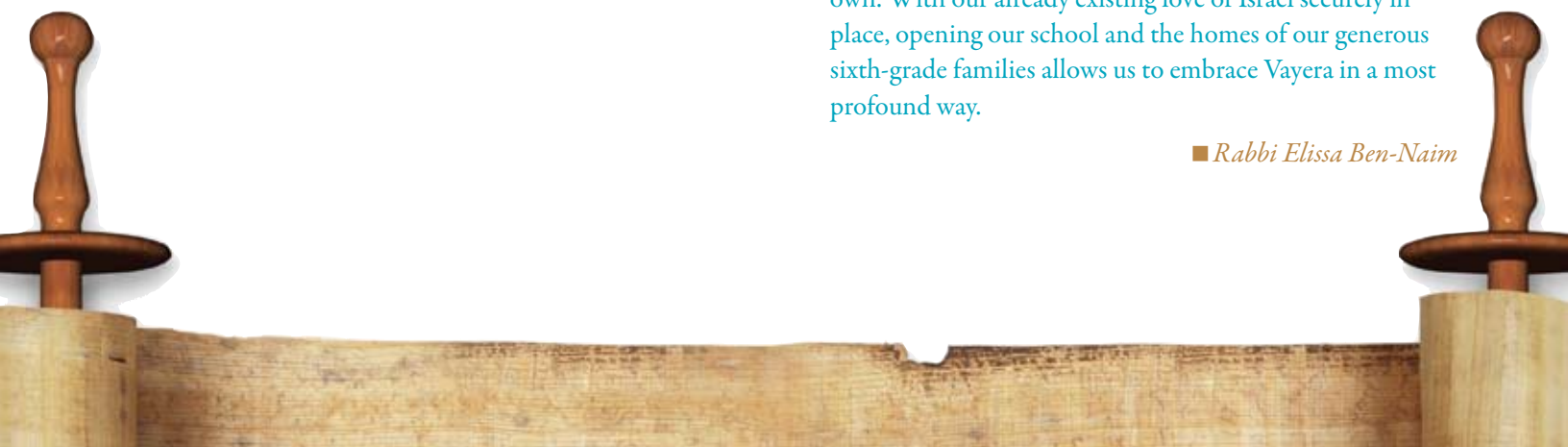
VAYERA | GENESIS 18-22:21

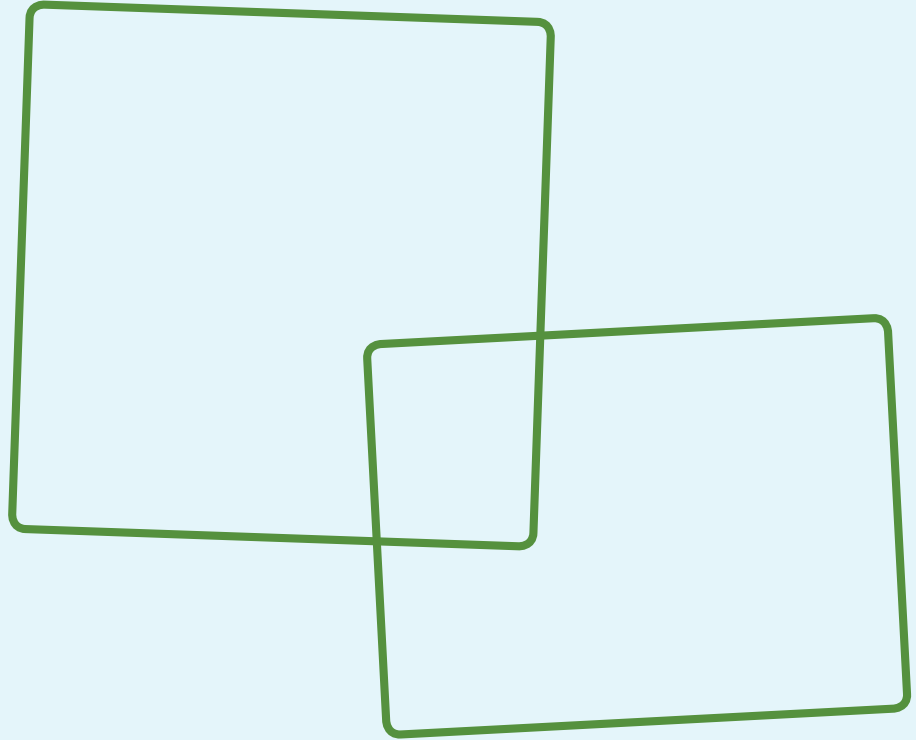

She creates an environment on our play yards that provokes and captures the children's imagination and sense of wonder. The outdoor environment is set up to facilitate play using a wide range of exciting supplies. These materials encourage exploration of different educational concepts such as physics (rolling items down ramps teaches about gravity), visual acuity (building structures with boxes, tires, spools and crates) and mathematics. In addition, the large scale of the materials inspires the children to work together in their creations, thus encouraging social-emotional growth. Exciting opportunities for the summer of 2009 are now available at Wilshire Boulevard Temple Camps, in Israel and with teen leadership programs.

From June 24–August 23 at **Camp Hess Kramer**, and from June 24–August 9 at **Gindling Hilltop Camp**, sessions are available from eight to twenty-six days for campers entering grades 3–10. At Camp Hess Kramer, a feeling of community is created through the energy and spirit, the *ruach*, of the 350 people who live at camp during any given session. Gindling Hilltop Camp has a sense of intimacy with 150 campers and staff, ensuring that everyone knows everyone. The close and lasting friendships formed at Wilshire Boulevard Temple Camps show what it truly means to be part of something extraordinary.

High school students have the opportunity to **travel to Israel** with Wilshire Boulevard Temple Camps and the North American Federation of Temple Youth (NFTY). Following an amazing 4-week adventure, participants return home with countless personal accomplishments, meaningful memories and stories never to be forgotten.

The **NFTY Leadership Experience** at URJ Kutz Camp in Warwick, New York, is designed for students entering grades 10–12 who are looking for a challenging, intense leadership program. Teens and adults work in partnership to enhance the talents and skills of each individual through mentorship and peer leadership.

Reform Jewish teens in grades 10–12 can experience social action in a program combining direct hands-on involvement in communities with opportunities rooted in Jewish social and ethical issues through the **URJ Mitzvah Corps**. Participants live communally with other teens and engage in meaningful social justice work. The two- to four-week programs take place in Israel, Costa Rica and throughout the United States.

# Sanctuary Update

If a chunk of plaster falls from the ceiling and nobody hears it, does it still make a sound? The answer, in the case of our beloved sanctuary, is an emphatic YES!

On October 23, a 10-pound piece of plaster fell 60 feet from the ceiling of the sanctuary, landing very close to the east stairs to the *bimah*. Fortunately, the piece fell when the sanctuary was empty, just two weeks after the sanctuary was filled with congregants for Yom Kippur. Had it fallen during services, someone could have been seriously injured—or worse. Under the direction of Executive Director Howard Kaplan, architect Brenda Levin and Bill Ehrlich, scaffolding was quickly erected and a team of specialists was called in to examine the damage. Materials inspectors and engineers are working now to determine what caused the plaster to fall, if other areas of the ceiling are unstable, and what measures can be taken to prevent more from falling. For now, all Shabbat morning services are being held either in Factor chapel or Piness auditorium. Safety is our immediate concern.

While we are grateful that no one was hurt, the falling plaster sends an urgent message that underscores the importance of the work we have been planning for years to begin as soon as sufficient funds were raised. We have noticed tiny flakes of plaster falling for years. This new development of such a large piece of plaster breaking free creates real urgency and importance to the sacred task of restoring what is arguably the most beautiful synagogue sanctuary in America.

From atop the scaffolding, the view provides a breathtaking and never-before-seen perspective of the sanctuary. There is no doubt that restoring the coffered ceiling—135-feet wide and 100-feet high—will be a monumental undertaking that will take years of painstaking, exacting work. This is no less true of restoring the windows, murals, *bimah*, chandeliers, infrastructure, air conditioning and finishes. But it is equally clear that there is nothing we cannot do if we believe and work together. And there is no doubt the end result will be staggering and awe inspiring in its beauty.

Our sanctuary is truly the wonder of Los Angeles and we must act expeditiously and prudently to ensure that the work is performed with as much skill and talent as possible. Our sanctuary is our home, but it is also a living symbol that embodies the hopes, dreams, aspiration and *vision* of the men and women

who built it. Of course, we have an historic opportunity not only to restore and beautify the sanctuary for another 100 years, but to build a dynamic Jewish community in the ever growing heart of Los Angeles. Already, our Erika J. Glazer early Childhood Center has brought dozens of young children and their parents into the Temple family nearly every day of every week. Next year we anticipate even more children, more laughter and more Torah in the Temple's halls.

When the sanctuary was dedicated in 1929, the congregation was approaching its 70th anniversary. Now, almost 80 years later, we will bring the same passionate vision and commitment to restoring it. As we await the day when we worship together in a beautifully restored sanctuary, we will remember that when this chunk of plaster fell from the ceiling—*everyone* heard it and we all turned our gaze to the future, each doing our part to move forward together.
