## Giving—And Receiving

“Don’t leave Egypt without Darfur” was the clarion call we sent out to the congregation last spring, and by the time we reached the end of Pesach, almost \$22,000 had been given as *tzedakah* to the Solar Cooker Project of Jewish World Watch (JWW). JWW wrote us: “We’ve successfully completed outfitting our first two refugee camps, Iridimi and Touloum, and your generous donation will help jumpstart the opening of a third camp at Oure Cassoni as well as

provide replacement cookers for the first two camps.”

One often imagines that to receive is better than to give; after all, those who get are almost always most in need. What is given can be as fundamental as these solar cookers, which use sunlight to create drinkable water and nourishing food, as well as provide security by sparing the women from having to forage for firewood amid the Janjaweed militants. Yet, for all our faraway friends have gotten from our *tzedakah*, I feel—and I’ll

bet all our contributors do, too—what Jewish tradition teaches: that the real beauty is in the giving. That’s why we call it *tzedakah*—righteous contributions.

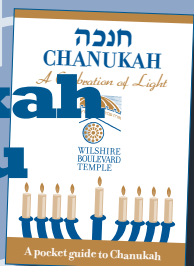
Along with these images, JWW has provided DVDs for all our schools about how the solar cookers are being used in the camps, thus giving our kids the privilege of seeing the “end point” of what a few thousand *mensch*es can do....

# Leah & Rachel

## *A Lesson in Love*

### Vayitzei, Genesis 28:10-32:3

Every family has its share of “drama.” This is true for our families, and it was certainly true for our biblical ancestors and their families. Think about it. Cain and Abel lived and died in bitter rivalry; Moses, Aaron and Miriam balance out an intricate triangle of interdependency. Then there are Leah and Rachel, who as two sisters married to same man, probably have one of the most complex relationships in the entire Torah.

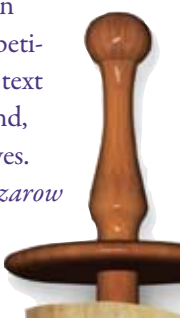
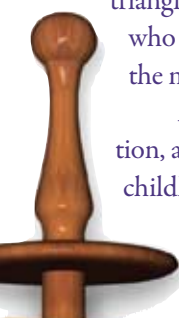
As Jacob’s wives, they seem to be rivals, vying for his attention, affection and ability to produce children. However, their childhood relationship is veiled in the silence of the text. With no mention of their mother, tradition suggests that the

sisters grew up in an emotional vacuum and were drawn together by a mutually supporting “self-mothering” bond.

In allowing her elder sister, Leah, to take her place as Jacob’s bride, Rachel shows a deep-seated love that is equal to, if not greater than, her love for Jacob. Through this overwhelming act of kindness we see that their relationship is underpinned by a mutual concern that was never entirely disrupted. On the surface, the women seem to be competitors; however, the insights of our tradition and imaginations present a picture of silent partners, allies for a greater purpose.

Our own relationships with siblings, parents, children and friends are also complex combinations of caring, competition, jealousy and concern. By getting “inside” the printed text to hear the voices of our biblical families, we can understand, elevate and heal the important relationships in our own lives.

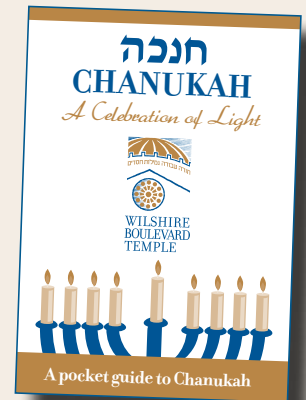

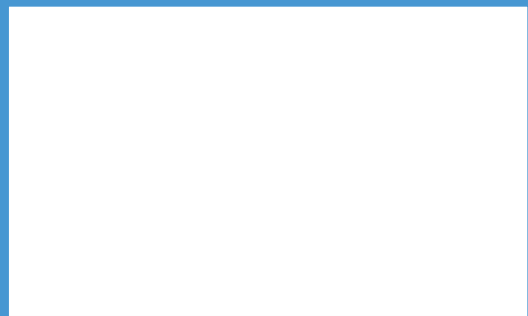

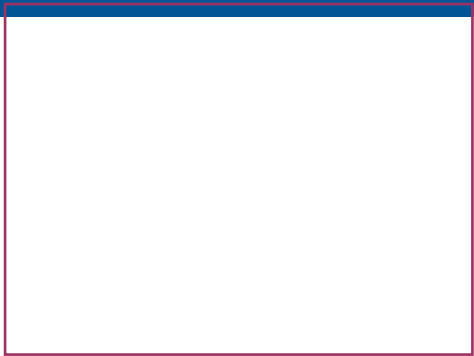


# RETREAT HA’GADOL 2008

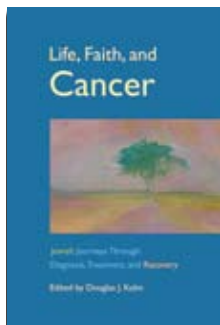

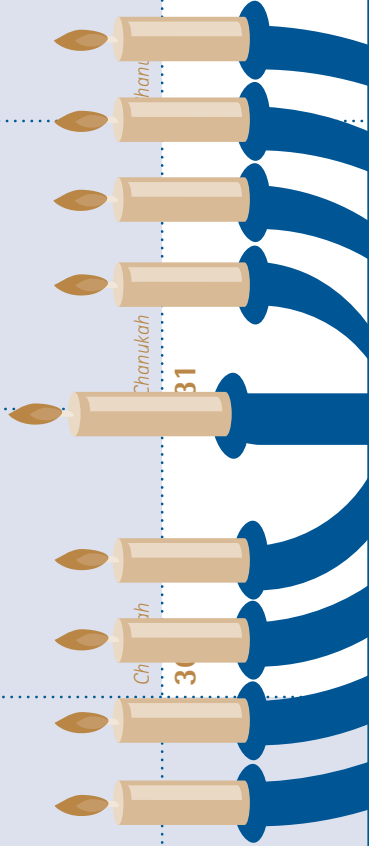
