Wilshire Boulevard Temple Camps Become Members of GRINSPOON INSTITUTE FOR JEWISH PHILANTHROPY

Wilshire Boulevard Temple Camps were recently accepted as a member of the Grinspoon Institute for Jewish Philanthropy. A program of the Harold Grinspoon Foundation, the Grinspoon Institute assists Jewish nonprofit overnight camps in creating and sustaining vibrant boards, developing strategic plans, reaching out to alumni and donors, and raising funds. Its staff and mentors are committed to providing member camps with the resources and tools needed to succeed and to strengthen their organizations. In addition, the Grinspoon Institute offers financial support to member camps with its Matching Challenge Grant and Legacy programs.

Professional and lay leaders have begun working with Eric Phelps, our Grinspoon adviser, in the areas of board development and fundraising. Under the direction of Phelps, members of our camp staff and camp committee, along with camp alumni and Temple members, will gather on January 30–31 at the Steve Breuer Conference Center for a strategic planning retreat to begin identifying short-term and long-term goals for improvements and additions needed at both Camp Hess Kramer and Gindling Hilltop Camp.

Recently, Camp Committee Chair Teri Hertz, Camp Director Douglas Lynn and I attended the Grinspoon Institute's

seventh annual Camp Conference in Chicopee, Mass. Seventy-four of the 75 member camps were represented. Presentations were made by leaders in the field of philanthropy, best practices of member camps were shared and sessions were presented on topics including Board Governance, Fundraising Leadership, Endowment Programs, Strategic Planning and Social Networking on the Internet.

Acceptance as a Grinspoon Institute camp is something to be celebrated. Hard work is ahead for the lay and professional leaders of our Wilshire Boulevard Temple Camps, and with the guidance and expertise of the Grinspoon Institute, exciting developments will be taking place at Camp Hess Kramer and Gindling Hilltop Camp. Stay tuned for future updates!

SH'MOT | EXODUS 1:6

Once the Israelites entered Egypt, they were “prolific and fertile; they multiplied and increased in number” (Exodus 1:6). The Egyptians feared the growing number of new immigrants and forced them into hard physical labor and dangerous working conditions. The Pharaoh, who no longer remembered the good that Joseph had done for the Egyptian nation, insisted that baby boys be killed at birth.

Two midwives opposed the direct order from the Pharaoh and let the boys live. These women were impressive. The *Women's Torah Commentary* (URJ, 2007) notes that “it is unclear” from the Hebrew language whether these women who defied the Pharaoh were Jews or Egyptian midwives who served the Hebrew women. Their non-Hebrew names shed light on their role as well: Shifrah means “one who shines forth,” and Puah, “a fragrant blossom.” When these Egyptian women risked their lives to birth Jewish babies, they sent forward a light and a fragrance, indicating that they became the first righteous gentiles.

The text says that “the women were awed by God.” We understand this to mean that they did not fear the human Pharaoh. The midwives stood tall, defying the Pharaoh and saving human lives in a decisive moment. Their relationship with God brought them an internal strength and spiritual awareness. They recognized the power and strength of the One God, the One who brought justice and compassion into the world. Their role was to bring these characteristics into the world as well.

May we absorb the strength and courage of Shifrah and Puah, and be able to act with faith in moments that test us, in our time and at all times.

Hi Rabbi Stein,

I want to share with you the unexpectedly poignant experience I had while working the food line at OPCC last Sunday morning. After serving coffee to more than fifty homeless people—soon becoming a blur of anonymous disheveled and hapless denizens of L.A.'s boulevards of broken dreams, each with his or her own tragic story—I was confronted with a familiar face: It belonged to Brian, my friend and hairstylist for almost fifteen years, until he had inexplicably dropped out of sight three years ago.

When I met him in the glamorous early '90s, he was working at a top Beverly Hills salon with Jennifer Lopez, Nicole Kidman and wealthy Rodeo Drive matrons as clients. He used to throw extravagant birthday parties for himself at his favorite Mexican restaurant on Melrose, effusively greeting his guests in a flowing, open white tuxedo shirt with a tray of fresh margaritas. The once-blonde Adonis with a swimmer's body bore little resemblance to the gaunt figure in ill-fitting thrift shop clothes standing before me now. Unemployed, broke and dying of AIDS, he was living on the streets, like so many other invisible homeless people I'd hurried past, cell phone pressed urgently to my ear.

I suddenly felt embarrassed and guilty, remembering our last encounter ...

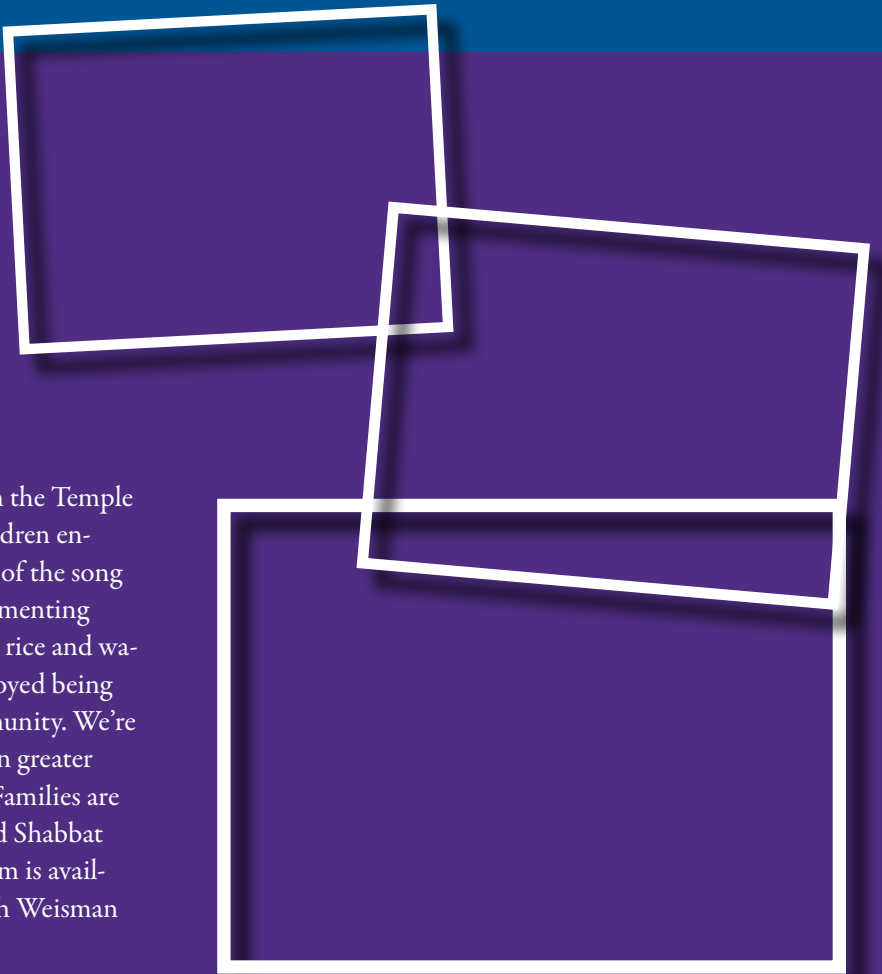

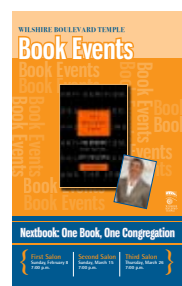
